Sarthe celebrated the 100-year anniversary of the legendary 24 Hours of Le Mans race, between June 20 and 22, 2023. Founded in 1923, the competition has made a long-lasting contribution to the history of motorsport worldwide and is a key part of the region's identity.

2023 - RACE OF THE CENTURY

The centenary 24 Hours of Le Mans race was a momentous occasion. With new rules introduced in 2020, the Le Mans Prototype, or LMP1, cars will be replaced with HyperCars known as LMH and LMDH, meaning the big constructors that forged the Le Mans legend will make their return this year. The 2023 race pitted the constructors -Toyota and Peugeot, Cadillac and Ferrari – against one another, with Ferrari making its big come back after 40 years, while Porsche defended its many Le Mans victories. Epic racing!

GETTING TO THE CIRCUIT

Le Mans is connected to Paris by many high-speed, direct train services:

- Roissy Charles-de-Gaulle airport to Le Mans: 1 h 40 (7 trains per day)
- Paris Montparnasse station to Le Mans: 55 minutes

On arrival at Le Mans station, the simplest way is to take the T1 tram that runs non-stop, 24-hours-a-day during the race weekend.



Four days of vintage-style celebration with almost 800 cars dating from 1923 through to 1993 and 1,000 drivers competing on the legendary track, will bring the history of this world-famous endurance circuit back to life. While the engines roar on the racetrack, nearly 8,500 vintage cars across 60 different brands will showcase their profiles in various "villages" around the circuit. The event will be studded with many activities, from American drive-ins and concerts, a vintage bus tour and 1960s dance floor to a vintage car auction and much more.

ZERO GHG EMISSIONS TARGET BY 2025

The aim of Mission H24, launched by the Automobile Club de l'Ouest, is to create a 100% clean supercar that emits only water. The first LMPH2G was initially launched in 2020, revealing some significant performance data: 0 to 60 mph in 3.4 seconds and a top speed of over 186 mph! Still under development, the car should take part in its first 24 Hours of Le Mans in 2025.

This supercar represents the future for motorsport - the race to reach zero greenhouse-gas emissions.



LE MANS, ROYAL CITY

The Plantagenet dynasty has made its mark on the Sarthe region. Walk in the footsteps of this Anglo-French family dynasty right at the heart of Le Mans.

PLANTAGENET CITY - STEP INTO THE PAST

Le Mans' historic center is impressive for its scale and uniformity. Spread over 15 hectares, it is made up of about a hundred timber-framed houses, with the oldest dating back to the 15th century. Many carved corner pillars and engraved lintels tell the story of the city's commercial activities and keep its legends alive. The bell tower of the Cathedral of Saint Julian rises up like a beacon, forming a link between the city's Roman and Gothic architectures. The cathedral houses two treasures, namely a magnificent chapel decorated with 47 painted angels playing musical instruments. And a stained-glass window depicting the Ascension, dating back to the 12th century - the oldest stained-glass window in the world still in situ.

GALLO-ROMAN WALL - ONE OF A KIND

Built between the 3rd and 4th centuries, these walls measured more than a kilometer, and encircled the old city of Vindinum, the capital of the Gallic people of Aulerques Cénomans. Today, only 500 meters of the geometrically patterned walls remain, punctuated with 11 towers and three archways. Le Mans' walls are the best preserved of those from the ancient Roman empire, alongside those of the two imperial capitals, Rome and Constantinople, known now as Istanbul.

WALLS OF RENOWN

Visible from the river, the walls are mainly red in color and very striking. And this was doubtless the aim of its patrons - to demonstrate the city's power and wealth. The refinement of the patterns, whether diamonds, triangles or hourglass shapes, and the quality of the construction - with alternating brick patterns, rows of pale limestone and dark brown sandstone bound in pink mortar - reinforce this theory.



The City of Le Mans has initiated the UNESCO world heritage registration process for its Gallo-Roman walls.









CULTURE IN MOTION

STREET ART - LE MANS

The Plain Champs festival brings world-class street artists together on the first weekend in July. Over the three days, artists create live works on mobile structures and everything is in festival mode featuring DJ sets, local food trucks, children's workshops and more. The art works are then exhibited in all the city's neighborhoods. Every year Le Mans also commissions new, large-scale permanent wall paintings and there are almost 30 works scattered across the city for you to discover.









Seth

In 2022, 39 artists took their turn during the festival. Seth was one of them and he created a large-scale anamorphic piece spread across three buildings and six floors right in the center of Le Mans. The wall painting, called Rabbit Hole, takes us with Alice and the white rabbit into a dizzying world. His work was voted the second most beautiful wall art in the world in June 2022 by the Street Art Cities website.



IN JULY AND AUGUST, AT NIGHTFALL.

Cobblestones and façades of historic monuments are transformed into giant projection screens. As night falls, the Plantagenet City enters the stage, set for a unique journey through history and legends.

1001 ARCHAEOLOGICAL TREASURES

- CARRÉ PLANTAGENÊT

This archaeological museum looks back over Le Mans' long history showcasing outstanding artefacts collected during various archaeological digs. Come and see the Sablons treasure, comprising about one hundred pieces of Aulèrques gold from the 1 century BCE, the Plantagenet Enamel from the 12th century, or the Venus of Rextugénos from the 1st or 2nd century CE.



TOMB OF AN EGYPTIAN QUEEN - MUSÉE DE TESSÉ

Le Mans' Musée de Tesse has restored the full-scale funerary chamber of gueen Nefertari, the wife of Pharaoh Ramesses II. from ground 1250 BCF. Discover more than 250 works, items and even mummies - some are more than 4,000 years old. Be careful you don't get lost!



MORE THAN 200 CONTEMPORARY ARTWORKS - I F FIAA

This art center, located right at the heart of Le Mans' Visitation, offers permanent exhibitions by contemporary artists like Guy Ferrer, Bernard Pras and even Charlotte de Maupeou. Exhibitions by major international artists are regularly planned.

QUEEN'S ABBEY - ROYAL ARREY OF ÉPALL

In 1230 Bérengère de Navarre, Richard the Lionheart's wife, decided to found a large Cistercian abbey, the Royal Abbey of Épau. The building's Gothic architecture upholds the order's values to the letter, namely austerity and renunciation. The Department of Sarthe took over the abbey in 1958 and today it is one of the most significant cultural centers in Sarthe. Each year, the abbey's teams provide a large exhibition, a walk-through photographic display in the gardens, music festivals and sound illuminations for New Year.
